

BRIEF AND GENERAL SATICOY HISTORY



Long before Saticoy became a town, this land was first inhabited by the prehistoric Oak Grove people, an early coastal culture present in the region as far back as 3000 B.C., who made use of the area's natural springs and river resources. They were later followed by the Chumash village of Sa'aqtik'oy, a long-established settlement along the Santa Clara River. During the Mexican era the area formed part of Rancho Santa Paula y Saticoy, which was surveyed and subdivided in the 1860s as American settlers arrived. The modern townsite of Saticoy was officially platted along the Southern Pacific Railroad in 1887, marking the community's transition from indigenous and rancho lands to a formally surveyed township.
